Details	<p>Not everyone knows that Tewkesbury born countryside writer, John Moore had a younger sister, who became just as well known in her own world of hounds and hunting. She became a world famous expert on foxhounds and their pedigrees, writing several books and contributing regularly to the sporting and rural press. She kept meticulous diaries from 1930 to the 1980's, liberally illustrated with her own delicate colour illustrations and many photographs.</p> <p>It is on these diaries that Alastair Jackson has based his book, "Lady of the Chase". We shall never experience again the unspoilt rural Britain in the form which Daphne Moore loved and recorded with such devotion. Added to the unusual history of the Moore family and her experiences before, during and after the War, this book is likely to be increasingly valued as a fascinating sporting and social document.</p> <p>The museum is delighted to host author Alastair Jackson who will be talking about his book and his researches into the fascinating life of John Moore's sister.
